...WEEKLY NEWSLETTER HITS THE PRESSES...This is the first edition of a new weekly two-page newsletter being published by the Evergreen Office of College Relations to inform Olympia-area residents of the school's activities. Editor Judy Prentice said copies would be mailed to local subscribers and would be distributed in more than 20 area restaurants. It replaces the former bi-monthly publication.

...STUDY SHOWS EVERGREEN TRANSCRIPT SUCCESSES...An initial study shows that the acceptability of Evergreen's student transcripts at other colleges and universities has been running at a near-perfect level, according to Registrar Perrin Smith. Since Evergreen's academic program is not divided into a traditional course/department structure and since the college does not evaluate students by the letter/grade method, many persons have been openly worried about the "transfer-out" problem for students. Smith's study indicates that as of November his office had issued 309 transcripts and in only three cases did questions arise from institutions receiving the documents. "Each of the three cases was readily resolved by providing conventional course equivalents and the amended transcripts were fully accepted," Smith reported.

...KORMONDY NAMED PROVOST...President Charles J. McCann announced the appointment of Academic Dean Edward J. Kormondy as Provost December 28. Kormondy, 46, became Evergreen's chief academic officer immediately, replacing David G. Barry, who has carried the joint responsibilities of Vice President and Provost since joining the college staff in 1969. Barry remains as Vice President and is the president's representative in off-campus relationships to educational, governmental, legislative and community groups.

...40 REGISTER FOR PART-TIME STUDIES...Forty Olympia-area residents registered for part-time studies Winter Quarter. The part-time registration, completed January 2, was the largest in Evergreen's history. It was also the first time three Coordinated Studies programs were offered which had been specifically designed for part-time students from the community. A group contract and a few individual contracts were also available.

...KAOS --- FULL TIME JANUARY 8...KAOS, Evergreen's new radio station (89.3 on the FM dial) will begin full-time operation January 8 if final approval from the Federal Communication Commission is received. Broadcast hours will be from 6 p.m. to midnight.

...FAMILY FILM SERIES BEGINS...A new weekly series of public film showings, sponsored by the Wilderness and Consciousness Group Study Contract, premiered January 3 and will run for the next ten weeks at 7:30 p.m. in Lecture Hall One. Some 15 films, all of which have nature and wilderness themes, including some Walt Disney specials, will be shown for a \$1.00 donation for adults and 50 cents for children under 12. ...SCREEN ARTISTS JOINS FACULTY...Loren Sears, a 30-year-old creative screen artist from San Francisco, has received a Winter Quarter appointment to the Evergreen faculty. Director of Canyon Cinema Cooperative in San Francisco, Sears is a 1961 graduate of the University of Oregon and has done graduate studies at Syracuse University and the University of Michigan.

...PLAY TRYOUTS OPEN TO OLYMPIANS...Olympia-area residents are invited to participate in tryouts for the Winter Quarter production of "Dark of the Moon," which will be held from 3 to 5 p.m., January 8-10 on the fourth floor of the Library. Rehearsals for the cast of 26 will begin January 15 and will be held from 3 to 5 p.m. daily five days a week. The play will be presented February 28, March 1, 2 and 3.
