...ST. PETER HOSPITAL AND CITY OF OLYMPIA SIGN INTERN AGREEMENTS...In what is described as a "major breakthrough in community relations," the Evergreen Office of Cooperative Education has recently completed internship agreements with St. Peter Hospital and the City of Olympia. Ken Donohue, director of the Co-op Office, said six-to-eight students will be working in the Olympia hospital by the end of the month in a program "which opens up fantastic learning opportunities and resources to Evergreen and provides the hospital with the potential for a qualified para-professional employment pool." The contract with the city provides for four paid internships per quarter, each assigned to complete a specific research task in one of four areas: Inter-City Transit, state and federal grant programs, outdoor burning bans, and recycling of solid waste material. The program will be coordinated through Olympia City Supervisor Eldon Marshall and his administrative assistant Larry Yok. Student interns at St. Peter will be directed by Barbara Soule, hospital coordinator.

...CITIZENS ACTION NETWORK COVERING LEGISLATURE...Twenty-two Evergreen students began covering the 1973 session of the state legislature last week in an effort to provide up-to-date information on the status of bills in four main interest areas: environment, social and health services, education, and other areas of concern such as Initiative 276 and tax reform. ...NEW FACULTY PUBLICATION ANNOUNCED...The Evergreen Symposium, published by three members of the faculty, will come off the presses Feb. 1. ...KAOS --- FULL-TIME...KAOS, Evergreen's new FM radio station, hit the airwaves full-time last week and can now be heard from 5:30 p.m. to midnight weekdays and from 4 p.m. to midnight weekends. The 10-watt station, which can be received at 89.3 on the FM dial, has not established a definite program pattern, but has scheduled a 6 p.m. news show which includes a community service bulletin to which the public is encouraged to contribute.

...COMMUNITY RESIDENTS INVITED TO VISIT PRESCHOOLERS...In an attempt to acquaint children of the Evergreen Day Care Center with activities of the adult world, Center Director Bonnie Gillis is inviting Olympia-area residents to visit the center on the Driftwood Road and share their time and talents with the youngsters, ages four months to five years. "We're hoping persons of all ages --- from senior citizens to elementary students --- will visit the children and share their talents with them," Ms. Gillis said.

...NATURE OF MAN LECTURE SERIES BEGUN...The Nature of Man is being explored in a Wednesday morning lecture series which began January 10 and will run through Winter Quarter. Open to the public, the 90-minute presentations will begin at 10:30 each Wednesday in Lecture Hall Five. Provost Ed Kormondy will deliver the January 17 lecture on "Man as An Ecological Being."
