

Nomenclature: T.E.S.C. All Campus Study Day (A.C.S.D.)

When: One day per quarter (F,W,S) for 1985-86 and 1986-87. (Not cast in stone forever--an experiment to see if we as a community get enough benefit to make it worthwhile.)

Who: All T.E.S.C. Persons--Administrators, Staff (as many as can get off), Students, Faculty, Trustees, Selected Community Leaders by invitation.

What: Everybody in this College Community studies one text (visual, musical, written all okay), hears lectures (talks) about it by interested/knowledgeable community persons, then all seminar on text.

Where: Possible schedule: Tuesday or Thursday

9:30 a.m. Lectures/talks at 7 or 8 selected large audience locations, with microphones, etc.

11:00-12:30 Lunch, small group discussions, rereading of text.

12:30-3:30 Seminars at all available seminar sized rooms -- at least one faculty assigned per room.

Which: Possible texts: All the world to choose from -- all cultures, all sexes, all orientations, including some basic documents from our major culture that we often overlook.

How: Create T.E.S.C. All Campus Study Day DTF (five people have agreed to serve so far), get Administration to assign Administrative Staff support (scheduling, text reproduction, phone answering, etc. -- \$ and time, not words, please), DTF calls for suggestions, meets, discusses and decides on texts for 1985-86 and implements A.C.S.D.

Why: Perhaps, just perhaps, the way to have community is to choose behaviors that cause people to be together, to think and study together. Worth a try?
