SUBJECT:

Use of head lettuce in the college food service with regard to United Farm Workers movement.

The question has arisen regarding the utilization of head lettuce in the college food service and whether or not the college will authorize the food service to use other than that produced by growers under contract with U.F.W. Until recently we have bid all our own produce, purchasing the least expensive, specifying U.F.W. lettuce when available.

The implications of this question centers primarily around availability of U.F.W. lettuce, price competitiveness of U.F.W. lettuce, and alternatives when U.F.W. lettuce is not available. I ask you to come together as a DTF for the following purposes:

- A. To survey the entire campus with regard to preferences concerning the following:
  - 1. Exclusive use of U.F.W. lettuce.
  - 2. Use of U.F.W. lettuce when it is available and use of other union or non union lettuce in the absence of its availability.
  - 3. Exclusive use of non U.F.W. lettuce.
- B. To report back to me on the process utilized in surveying the campus and the results of that survey in the following classifications: Students not on the board plan, students on the board plan, staff, and faculty.
- C. To present me with your interpretations of the results of the survey and recommendations regarding appropriate sources of head lettuce.

I ask that you come together initially on April 8 at 3:00 p.m. in the afternoon in room 3121 of the library building and that your final report be available to me no later than Wednesday, April 23 at 12:00 noon. I have in the meantime instructed Saga to purchase only U.F.W. head lettuce and to substitute other leafy vegetables in its absence.
