Visual Arts

The Expressive Arts faculty invite you to join them in a variety of exciting programs exploring personal, cultural and social themes. Program themes are drawn from the faculty's own interests and work as professional artists and writers. The faculty are committed to the importance of creative work as a central element in a liberal arts education. It is important for a student entering the Expressive Arts to have had a broad range of academic study and to continue that breadth of study by working both in and out of the Expressive Arts area at Evergreen.

At Evergreen, study in the Visual Arts allows you to work closely with faculty and other students in small workshops, seminars and labs. Lectures allow ample time for discussion, and opportunities to share work with other artists are built into the structure of study. Usually students enroll in only one full-time program at a time which allows for integrated study without the distractions of competing courses.

The recommended sequence of study in the **Visual Arts** is as follows:

First Year

Any Core Program. These programs provide essential educational background so important to beginning students. "Life on the Edge of a Continent" "Pacific Northwest: Her Story/His Story" "Society, Social Change and Expressive Arts"

Second Year

Sophomore-level, Expressive Arts Coordinated Studies program titled "Studio Project."

For an emphasis in film and video: "Recording and Structuring Light and Sound" or "The Televised Mind."

Third and Fourth Years

More specialized work, such as the following options provided in Visual Arts:
"Form and Function"
"Patterns: Commonalities Between Art,
Music and Science"
"The Heart of the Matter: Creative
Response to Women Writers"

Fourth Year

Senior project, internship, individual contract or other program of interest.

Advising Services

Our Advising Services enable you to make intelligent decisions about your education at each step of the way, rather than follow standardized requirements. In other words, you are able to work with a faculty or staff advisor in designing a coherent path through our Core, intermediate and advanced offerings. In this way you can combine programs, projects and internships as you work toward your degree. Internships


