Health and Human Services

Study in Evergreen's Health and Human Services stresses:

You can concentrate in one of the following areas:

Health Sciences Human Services Psychological Counseling

Health Sciences

This pathway prepares students for paraprofessional jobs in nutrition and health, naturopathic medicine, dentistry, medicine, and veterinary medicine and for graduate work in the biological sciences. Students in this branch should study inorganic and organic chemistry, and select from these programs: "Foundations of Natural Science," "Matter and Motion," and "Human Health and Behavior."

Human Services

This pathway prepares students for careers as advocates, caseworkers, administrators, planners, or counselors in a variety of settings, and for graduate work in many human service areas. Students in this pathway take the program "Human Health and Behavior," as well as related work in statistics, research methods, economics and public policy. Other related programs are: "The Human Condition," "Postmodernism and Human Services," "The Helping Professional," "Management and the Public Interest" and "Political Economy and Social Change."

Psychological Counseling

This pathway prepares students for paraprofessional work in counseling and mental health fields, and for graduate study in psychology, social work, and counseling. A strong liberal arts and sciences background is recommended, as well as the senior "Psychological Counseling" program. No more than one year of studying counseling is recommended. Students should also take coursework in statistics and research methodology.

What is an Evergreen "program"?


Instead of taking separate unrelated courses, full-time Evergreen students take one interdisciplinary program each quarter, combining a variety of subjects. Taught by a team of faculty, programs include lectures, seminars, workshops, readings, and research projects. Interdisciplinary programs allow you to focus on a theme or issue and combine a variety of subjects, such as psychology, sociology, nutrition, biology, and social welfare. In this way we emphasize a holistic view of human beings and society.

Internships

Internships are especially encouraged for advanced students since they provide an opportunity to check theory against practice and gain solid experience. Placement options include clinics, prisons, hospitals, schools, state agencies, the state legislature and more.

Advising Services

Our Advising Services enable you to make intelligent decisions about your education at each step of the way, rather than follow standardized requirements. In other words, you are able to work with a faculty or staff advisor in designing a coherent path through our Core, intermediate and advanced offerings. In this way you can combine programs, projects and internships as you work toward your degree. If you have chosen a field of study, if you are undecided, or if you change your mind later, our advisors can assist you in making appropriate plans.
