Art History Time Line: Prehistoric to Baroque

*Note: the birth of Jesus (0 or 1 AD) was used as the line of demarcation between BC (Before Christ) and AD (Anno Domini) by Pope Gregory after whom the Gregorian Calendar was named and which we continue to use today. Scholars of the last decade have used the terms BCE (Before Current Era) and CE (Current Era) to break the connection between time and christian ideology. The terms have changed, but the event separating BCE and CE has remained the same.
