

Community Project Options (fall quarter)

Doing the Right Thing liberal arts forums: A group of 5-6 students to meet with Hirsh after class to plan and facilitate the World Café settings for the Liberal Arts Forum on Oct. 9, (week 3), and November 7, (week 7)

Global and Local Visions art show: The show will open on Dec. 15, 2007. A group of 6-8 dedicated students will organize community art workshops, maintain contact with the artists and receive the art works, jury and hang the show, and at the end of the show, in February, return the art work to artists. Also will help with making labels for the show, creating a catalog and creating/maintaining a web site for the show.

Olympia Film Festival: Attend the orientation sessions and support the Silk Roads at OFS. Also work on documentary (video or written) visual/cultural ethnography of the festival.

Lunar Spring Festival concert: a group of students interested in dance and performing arts to develop with Hirsh a children's play based on Chinese folk tale for the concert on January 26, 2008.

Children's Book: Small groups of students to write and illustrate children's book on themes of Silk Roads and education. The finished product could be part of students' K-12 work and made available to local schools and libraries.
