On "intelligence," "working on the hard parts" and self-theories about intelligence Guiding question: What do we know about how people learn "something" well?

In the Introduction to *Mind at Work*, Mike Rose defines what he means by cognition and intelligence (see pp. xxiii). He writes, "Cognition refers to those mental processes involving perception, attention, memory, knowing, judging.

...Cognition is...intimately tied to motives and values, to long-range as well as immediate goals, and of one's life history. As a friend of mine put it, we're not just a brain in a bottle. We think in a material and social world." He goes on to note that intelligence is a much more specific term than cognition. He begins his discussion of intelligence with reference to a widely-accepted Western definition of intelligence: "the ability to learn and act on the environment, to apply knowledge to new situations, to reason, plan, and solve problems."
