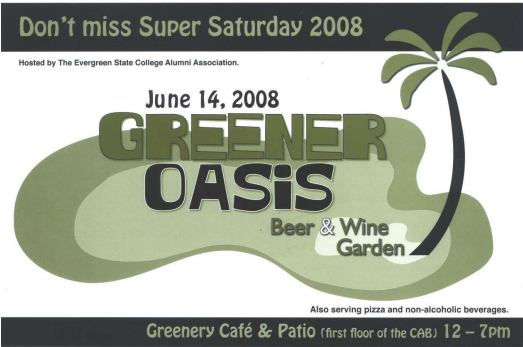


Support the Alumni's Greener Oasis at Super Saturday

Money raised at the Greener Oasis will be used for supporting two Alumni Scholarships to an undergraduate and graduate student. Join us for refreshment and conversation!



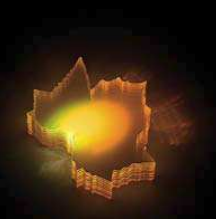
Readers Series A Huge Success

This year the Friends of the Evergreen Library partnered with The Deans at the College to inaugurate a brown bag lunchtime series, featuring Evergreen faculty, staff and alumnae in presentations of their work. We screened films, heard from people about their research and writing and found time to honor our colleagues. Thanks to The Friends support, we were able to provide some treats, coffee and lemonade to supplement everyone's lunch. The series was much appreciated and attended by people from all over the campus. On behalf of the Library, Lee Lyttle, Ernestine Kimbro, and Dean Rita Pougiales thank The Friends for their generosity.

**Presenters for this year were:**  
**Chico Herbison**, Member of the Faculty, who screened and discussed "Quiet Passages", a film he wrote that presents the experiences of Japanese women who married servicemen from the United States after World War II and came to Kansas to live with their husbands. The stories of these women's lives are mainly told through interviews with their children.  
Faculty Emerita, **Llyn deDanaan** presented two of her research projects on separate occasions. The first was a discussion of her research on the Roma, conducted in Romania under the auspices of a Fulbright

fellowship. Llyn also provided a showing in the Library of her photographs documenting the project.  
In a second presentation, Llyn talked about her ongoing research on Japanese immigrants who worked in South Puget Sound's oyster industry. She also showed a series of slides of her photographs which were paired with poems written by the workers.  
Staff member **Jimée Lowe** screened his film, "Red, White and Blues, an exploration of lynching in the United States and its related expression through the Blues.

Runners and walkers of all ages are invited to join in this great event that caps the Super Weekend activities. Awards will be made in thirteen age divisions.

Cash awards will be given to the male and female winners in the following categories:  
• Junior: 19 and under  
• Open: 20 - 39  
• Master: 40 - 49  
• Super master: 50 and older  
All event proceeds will support the Friends of the Evergreen State College Library in its mission to enhance the resource holdings and college and public outreach initiatives of the Library.

• 7:30 am - Registration/Check-in

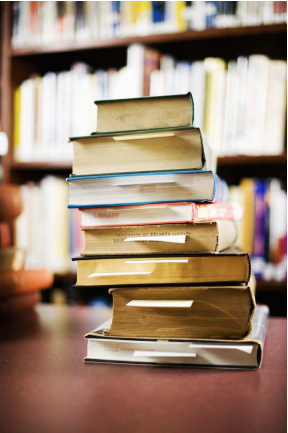
**Looking for Board Members**
