At Evergreen study in the **Humanities** stresses:

Literature, history, philosophy, anthropology, psychology and religion

Connections among language, thought, value, behavior and society

Attempts to imagine and make new relationships and societies

Evergreen's *interdisciplinary programs* combine ordinarily separate subjects under a cohesive theme or topic. Each program is taught by a team of faculty, has a full schedule of seminars, lectures, labs and workshops, and may have options for additional courses in related subjects. You usually take only one program at a time and each program spans one, two or three quarters, so you have an excellent opportunity to probe what you are learning and to undertake long-term projects.

The recommended sequence of study in **Humanities** is as follows:

First Year

Any *Core Program*. These programs provide educational background so important to beginning students.

Second and Third Year

Choose among the following programs:

Internships

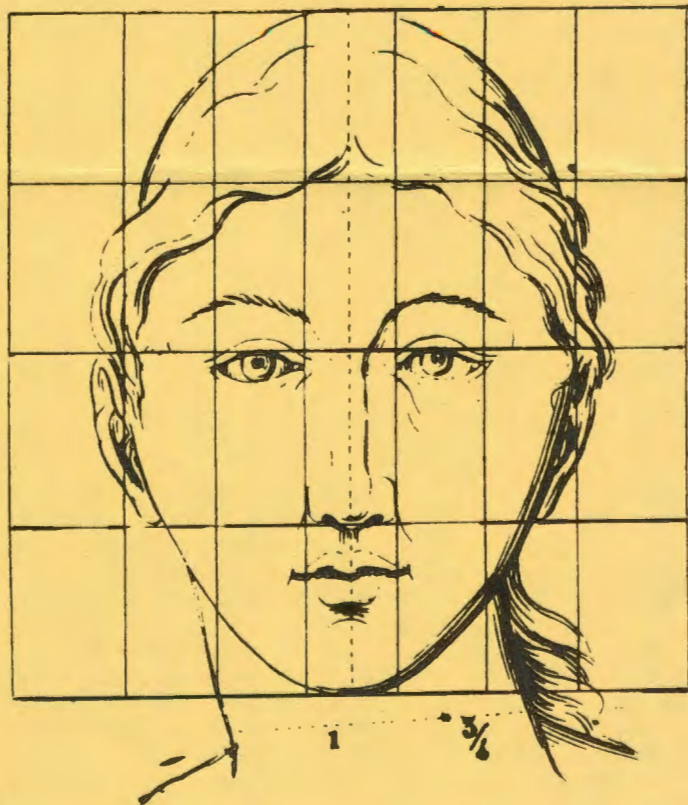

They have served as research analysts, and in a variety of capacities for public and private agencies. Evergreen graduates have won considerable recognition for their work in internships and individual projects.
