Artist's Statement

This design was inspired by an old ceremonial rattle from Coast Salish territory. In my interpretations, I often visualize family connections by joining the two. This was also done in my previous print, Wolf Brothers. The two eagles seen here represent my Grandmother and Mother. The central figure is a self portrait, depicting me as a child. When I was young, my mother was a single parent and I spent much time with my grandparents, hence my close ties to my grandmother.

Looking back over my time at my childhood I realize how protected I was, shielded from the outside by my family and specifically my grandmother and mother. Their intentions were good, as with most family when it comes to children, and it is something I can now appreciate as a parent looking out for the best interest of my own son. This print honors and pays tribute to the sacrifice my family has made for me to be who I am today, an artist of my people.

Certificate of Authenticity

This print is a limited edition original serigraph. Working from Shaun's original artwork, Paul created stencils for the two colors of *Moonchild Guardians*. The colors are black and red. This print is one of an edition of 150 hand printed on Arches Cover Cream paper. In addition, 7 printers proofs and 15 artists proofs were printed on Arches Cover Cream, for a total of 22 proofs. The paper size of the Arches is 28" wide and 21.5" tall. The image size is 24.5" W. x 17" H.

This edition was printed by Paul Nicholson of Bellevue, WA in 2007 with the assistance of the artist, Shaun Peterson.
