Wednesday, October 16th

Miscellaneous information

- You'll need to bring a bag lunch on Monday. Make sure you have it accessible in the van with you.
- If you haven't found tent space, you can borrow a tent from The Outdoor Program free of charge. Go to the equipment check out room of the Campus Recreation Center and tell them you are in IES.
