Beginning the Journey is a First-Year retention program that will be integrated into the three 16-credit Core programs listed above.

You will have an opportunity to work with faculty and Student Affairs practitioners as well as to develop relationships with your peers, who are starting the journey with you. You will establish connections within the College, develop and refine your academic skills, and begin to identify the planning and life skills you will need at college.
