Due Tuesday April 5th

Critical Reasoning Assignment for Tuesday April 5: Read the rest of *Critical Reasoning*, Chapter 2 and work out Chapter 2 Exercise 2.1 **even** items. Review, and modify the results from the small group exercise **III** and write a short statement of the main argument.

Ethics Assignment for Tuesday, April 5: **Read** Rachels Chapter 2 & 3. Focus particularly on the "Cultural Differences Argument," on Rachels' criticisms of cultural relativism, and on what can be learned from cultural relativism as well as his characterization of subjectivism and the role of reason in ethic. **Submit**: a brief description of the moral choice portrayed in the film that you discussed in Friday's Ethics Workshop 2-1 **IV** as well as an argument (or arguments) leading to the conclusion that the choice was morally acceptable or not.
